



PELOTAS, BRAZIL. Folded letter carried from Brazil "MAR 8 76", via London to NEW YORK, where it arrived "APR 17". Letter below carried by FRENCH PACKET via Bordeaux, where it arrived "JUN 6 76". Thence forwarded to NEW YORK, with arrival on June 19th, 1876. Postmarks of REO de JENARIO and NEW YORK (RED) are on reverse of both covers.

ECUADOR, SOUTH AMERICA. A very rare usage of the stamps of Great Britain and the 1 peso stamp of the second issue of Ecuador. Carried by British postal service, via PANAMA and LONDON, to PALERMO, ITALY, where it arrived "MAR 5 76" as per receiving postmark. The folded letter originated as per British postmark at "GUAYAQUIL JAN 6 1876", on reverse of cover. The BRITISH stamps are canceled with the "C41" obliterator of that office. The British charge in stamps was 1 shilling and 7½ pence. It was almost two months in transite.

U. S. MARINE CORPS
MAIL
NICARAGUA 1929



The U.S. Government, at the request of the conservative and liberal parties of Nicaragua, supervised the general elections in 1928. The U.S. Commission was composed of Army, Navy and Marine officers under Gen. Frank R. McCoy. All parties concerned agreed that they would abide by the final results and support the newly elected government. The liberals won but Augusto Sandino, a radical who had agreed to support the liberal party, reneged and took to the hills to lead a band of mercenaries to harass the government. Sandino, who was considered by many to be nothing more than a cutthroat bandit became the hero and namesake of the Sandistas in present day Nicaragua. At the request of the new government, the Marines were asked to remain and organize the National Guard of Nicaragua.

Both covers shown are endorsed "Marine Mail/No Stamps Available". The top cover originated at Bluefields and the other at Neptune Mine, Nicaragua. They are from Paul W. Walker/Marine Detachment/51st Co. 5th Reg't., 2nd Brig., Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua. Both entered the U.S. Mails, as per handstamp "Postage Due 2 Cents/From New Orleans, La." There is no indication that the Nicaraguan post office collected postage other than the postmark and the numeral T in circle for TAX DUE. The cover at the top bears the straightline handstamp PAQUEBOT indicating that it came off of a ship at New Orleans.

VENEZUELA VIA ST. THOMAS TO THE U.S.

U.S. SHIP The cover shown originated at La Guaira, Venezuela as per postmark May 7, 1863. It was probably carried by a private ship to St. Thomas in the Danish West Indies and placed in the ST. THOMAS EXPRESS OFFICE, which acted as a forwarding agent. Here it was handed over to the U.S.S. VANDERBILT, the flagship of the West Indies Blockading Squadron, then lying in the harbor. It was most likely carried to Philadelphia by a Naval vessel where it arrived as per postmark on June 13, 1863. Since it was brought in by a U.S. SHIP it was rated DUE 3 instead of the regular ship rate of 3 cents plus 2 cents ship fee. The 2 reales stamp, of the first issue of Venezuela only paid the local rate of Venezuela. A unique use of a commercial letter from Venezuela into the U.S. during the Civil War.

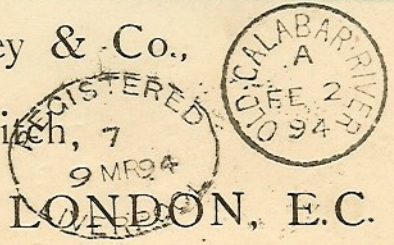

NIGER COAST - OIL RIVERS PROTECTORATE.

This British territory was first called OIL RIVERS under a Charter to the ROYAL NIGERIA COMPANY, which surrendered its charter in 1899. The following year the territory was divided into NORTHERN and SOUTHERN NIGERIA and then in 1914 to the colony and protectorate of NIGERIA. Cover above bears the entire first issue of OIL RIVERS overprinted on the stamps of Great Britain. Below, another registered cover bearing the portrait of Queen Victoria under the heading NIGER COAST OIL RIVERS PROTECTORATE, postmarked at OLD CALABAR July 22, 1895. Top cover used 1894.

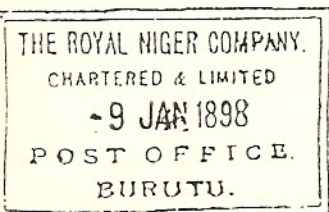




NIGER COAST 1897 - 1899.

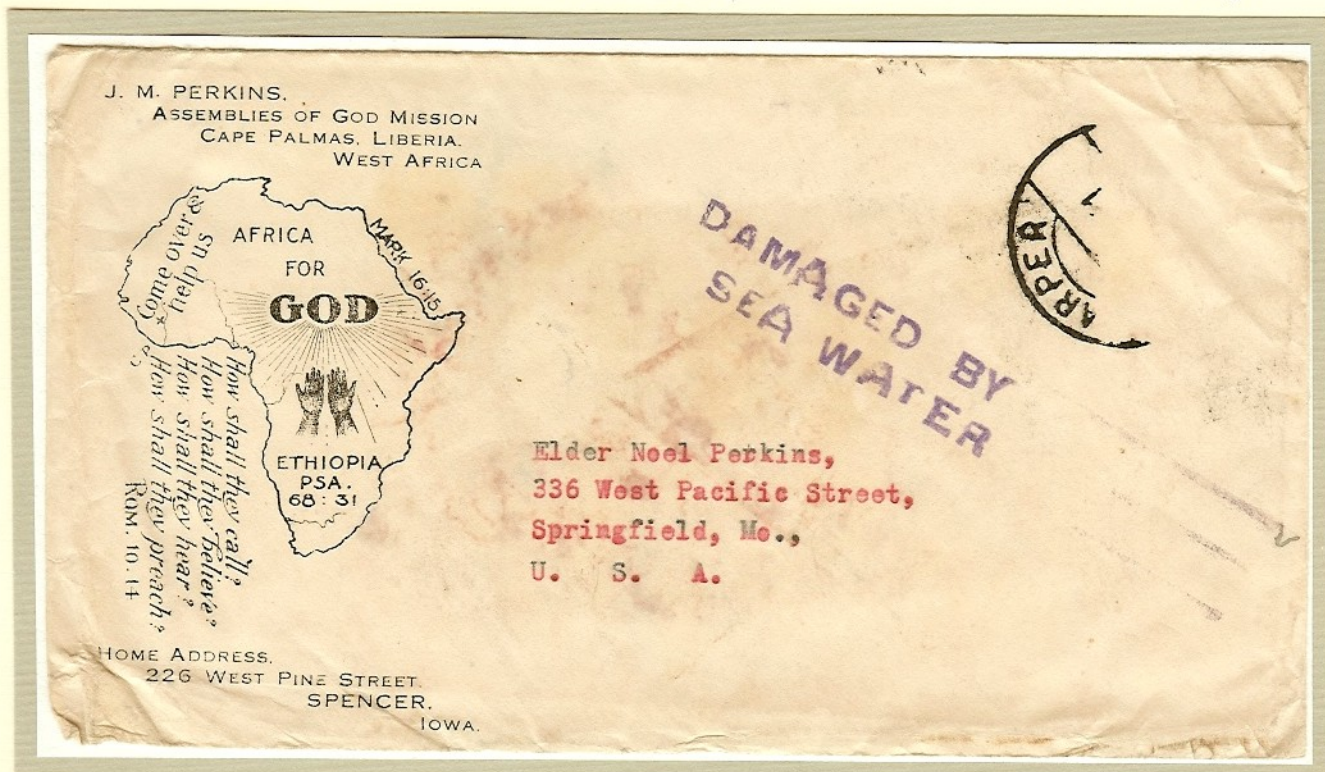
Stampless cover below to England endorsed "On Special Service/ no Stamps procurable./Wm.Smith Lt./1st WAFF", tied by the violet handstamp of THE ROYAL NIGER COMPANY at BURUTU. Transparently dated 1898 for 1899. It was charged "Due 2d" collect in blue crayon. Backstamped PAID in error - "PAID/LIVERPOOL/BR PACKET/ 2 FE 99". The "1d" is an accountancy marking of the British post office.





WRECK OF THE S.S. JEBBA.

The JEBBA was a 3,813 ton steamship of the African Steam Ship Company on her homeward voyage to England. In a fog, on the 18th of March, 1907, she ran ashore near South Devon and became a total loss. The passengers and mail survived. Cover above, which originated at Old Calabar, Southern Nigeria, was forwarded from England to Colombo, Ceylon, where it was again forwarded to Nuwara Eliya. Cover below originated at Harper, Liberia where it got wet while being carried by open boat from shore to ship.



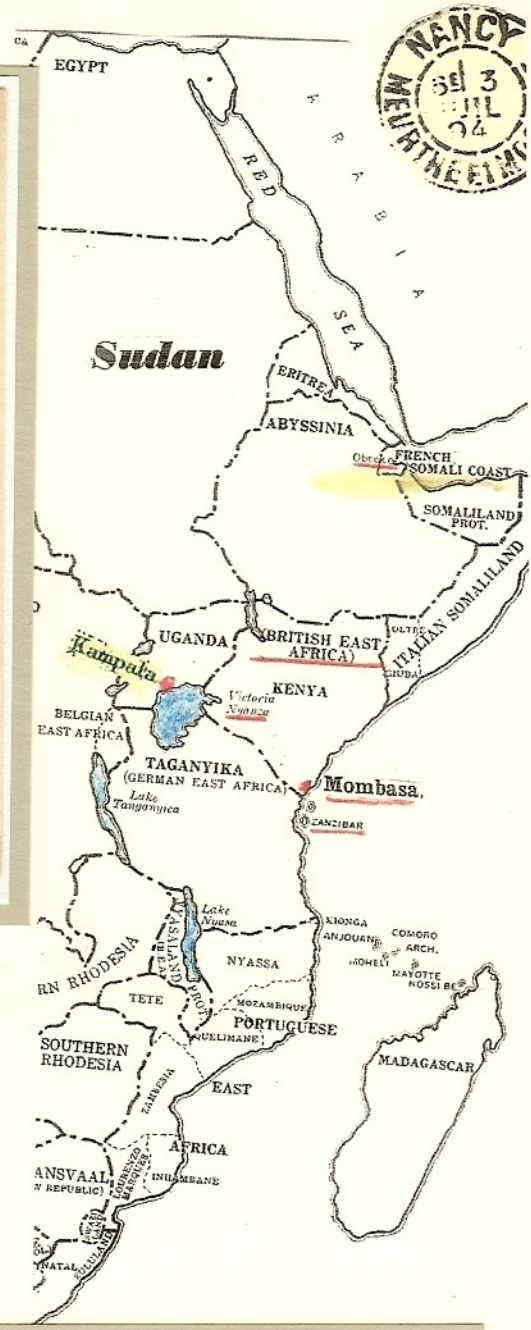
NYASSA, PORTUGUESE
EAST AFRICA

Located in the north-part of Mozambique in southeast Africa. It was administered by the Nyassa Company until about 1930 when it became part of the colony of Mozambique. On June 25, 1975 it became the Republic of Mozambique. Cover above was used to Switzerland via ZANZIBAR as per postmark on reverse dated the 7th of July, 1902. It bears the stamps of the first definitive issue postmarked in blue - COMPA DO NYASSA 4 JUL 02.

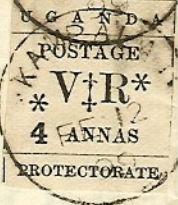
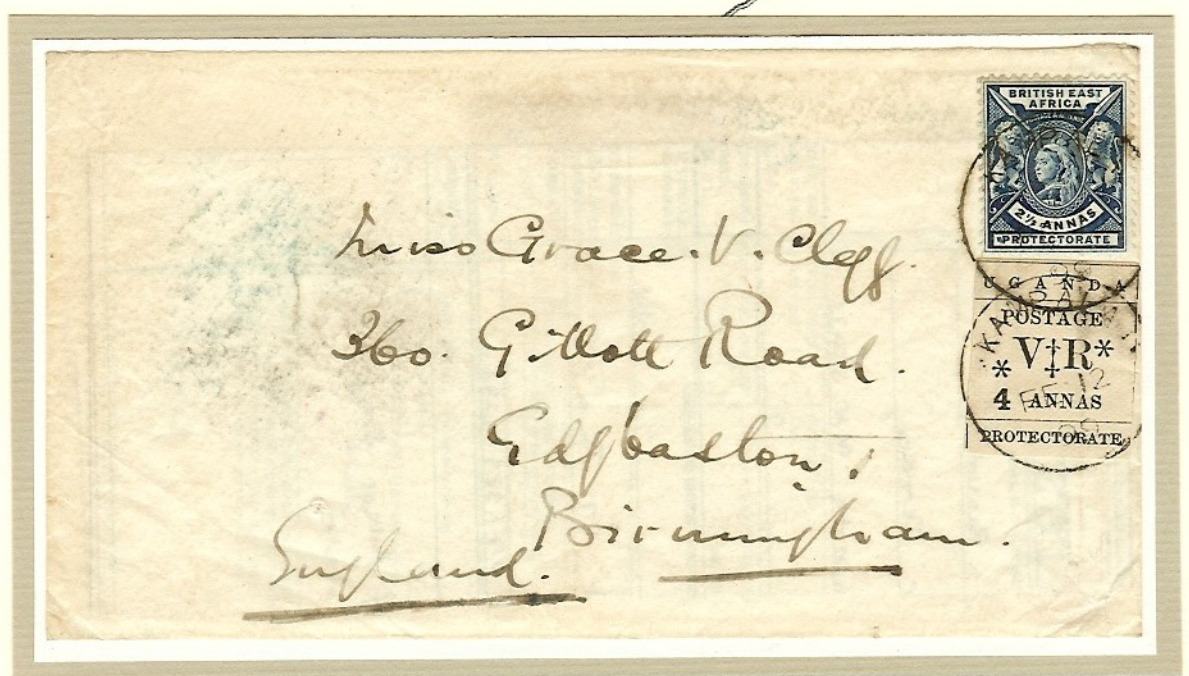


Cover above bears stamps from the last issue postmarked "COMPA DO NYASSA" April 23, 1928 "LAGO". A rare usage via FORT JOHNSTON, BRITISH NYASSALAND, April 28, 1928 to NEW ZEALAND..No arrival date.

East Africa



OBOCK was a seaport in East Africa on the Gulf of Aden in what became **FRENCH SOMALILAND** in 1884. Registered cover bears the stamps of the 1894 issue - 5 Frank and 30 centimes - addressed to Nancy, France. Cover below originated at Kampala, Uganda, on Lake Victoria, bearing the stamps of **BRITISH EAST AFRICA** and **UGANDA** - 2½ Annas and 4 Annas. Backstamped at **MOMBASA, MAR 23, 99** and **BIRMINGHAM, ENGLAND AP 15, 99**. A nice combination of the two British colonies.

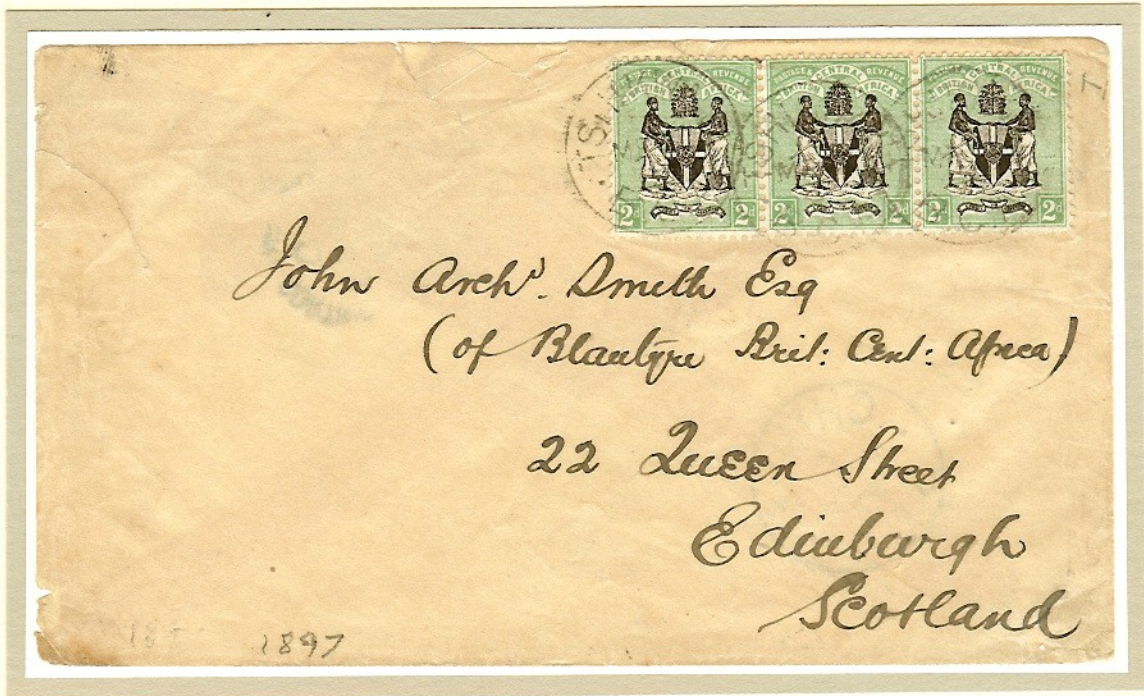
Located in Central Africa on the west shore of Lake Nyassa. Operated under charter to the British South Africa Co. In 1907 the name was changed to NYASSALAND PROTECTORATE. The cover shown bears the stamps of the first definitive issue bearing the coat of arms. Used from Chinde, B.C.A. April 26, 1897 to England where it arrived May 29th.

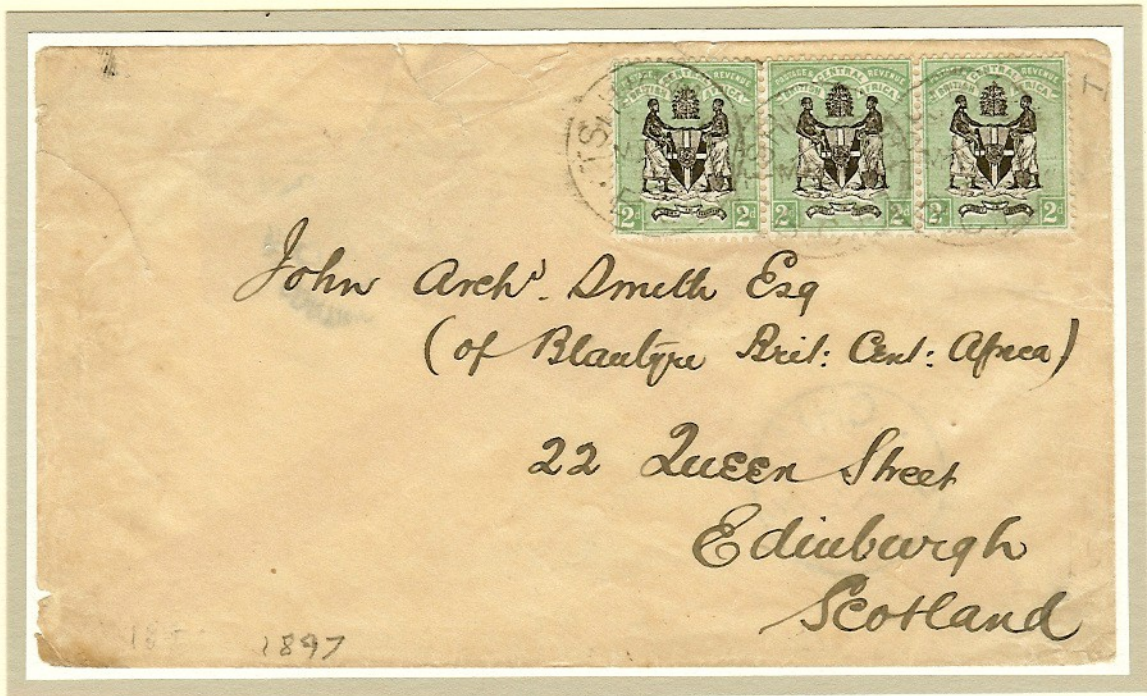

REUNION. The Island of Reunion is located in the Indian Ocean about 400 miles east of the Island of Madagascar. A former French colony until it became an integral part of the Republic of France. Cover above bears the stamps from the first definitive issue postmarked at St. Denis to GERMANY in 1899. Cover below used to Ann Arbor, Michigan from St. Andre in 1914.





BRITISH CENTRAL AFRICA. Cover above bears a strip of three of the first issue of the 2d value, to Scotland in 1897. It is backstamped CHINDE MR 12 97 B.C.A.. Cover below bears a strip of three of the 2d value, of the second issue, to England. Postmarked at FORT ANDERSON DE 15 98. It arrived at SOUTHAMPTON as a PACKET LETTER 27 JA 99.

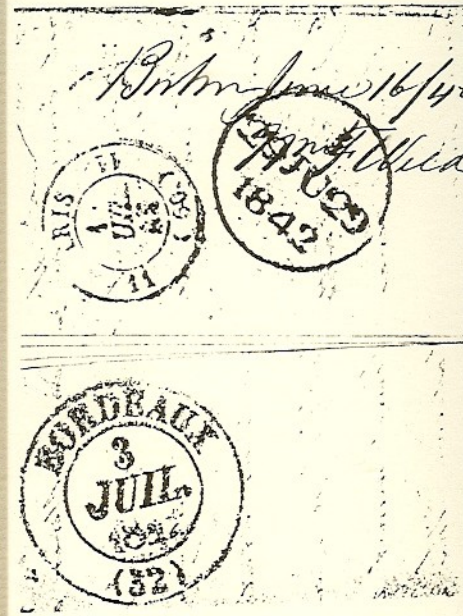

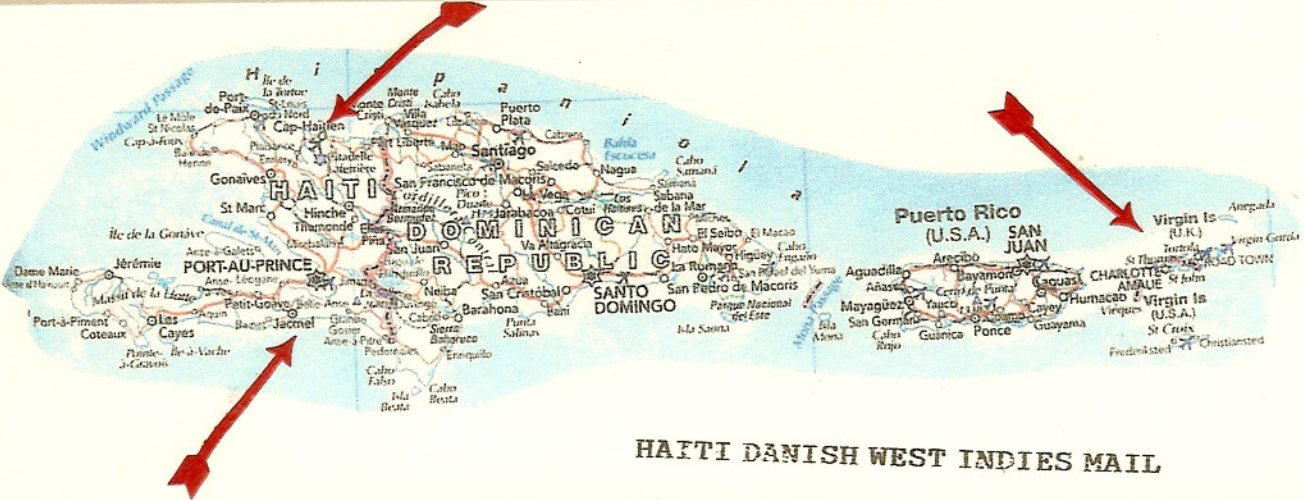
GONAIVES ,HAITI. May 9th [duplicate] and May 20th, 1842. "Messr. Classman & Co, Bordeaux [France]...We are here in the midst of ruin & terror caused by a dreadful Earthquake by which we were visited on the 7th Inst...May 20th...We are not yet recovered from the Panic caused.....and the accounts we daily receive from other parts of the Island are truly awful. The Cape [Haitien] is totally destroyed - St. Jago also. Our town about half down, nearly all the Houses in the Plantations levelled with the ground. Port au Prince and the west part of the Island have suffered but little. The loss of lives have been immense at the Cape - more than Six Thousand persons was buried under the Ruins of the Homes....F. Osler".

Letter carried out of the mails to Boston. Thence forwarded to England by Wm. F. Weld, where it received the LETTER PACKET, Jun 29 1842 cds and the "1/-" due. Thence to destination in France via British Packet.

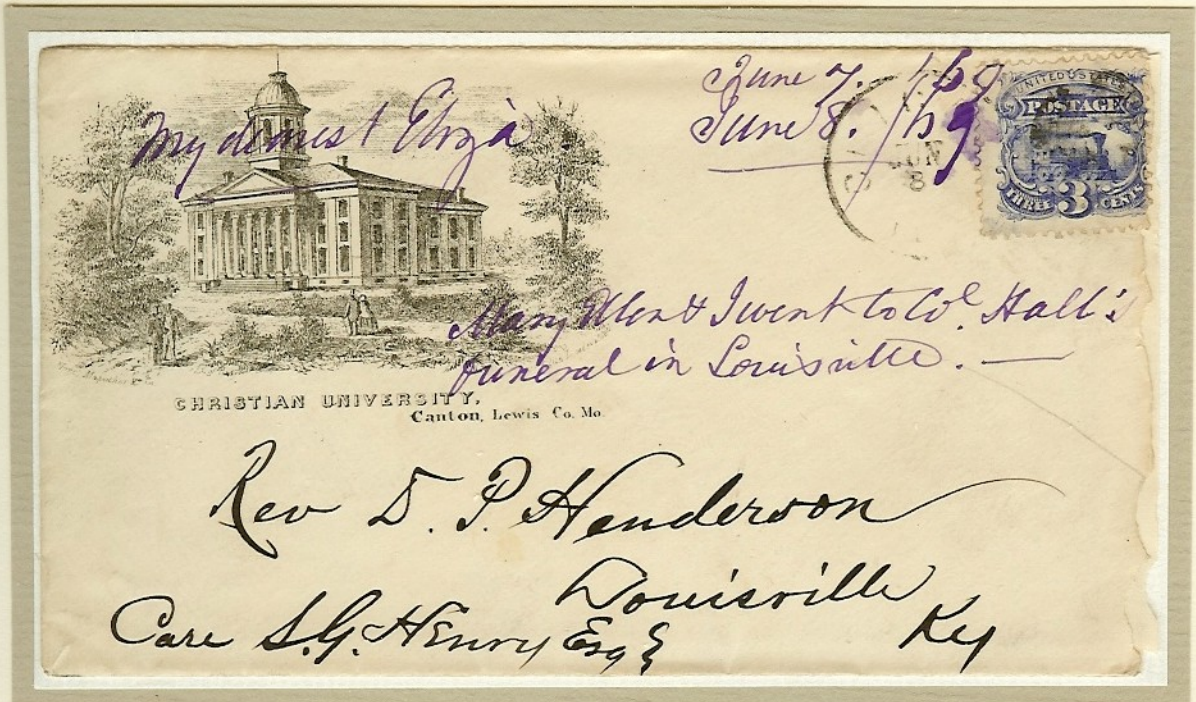

GREAT BRITAIN

The one penny black was the first adhesive postage stamp to be issued by a national government - May 6, 1840. Cover on right was used Sept. 9, 1840.



Cover on the right bears a strip of 5 and a single of the second issue, 1841, of the 2 penny printed on bluish paper. The cover was misdirected to Desoto City and then forwarded to Canton, Mo. as indicated by the corner card of Christian University. The 3¢ U.S. 1851 paid the forwarding charge.

BOER WAR 1900

Cover bearing 1d British stamp cancelled at "Field Post Office 17, located at Johannesburg, on June 12th. Hand-stamped RECOVERED FROM MAILS/LOOTED BY THE ENEMY in red. Backstamped ARMY BASE P.O. CAPETOWN on November 12th.



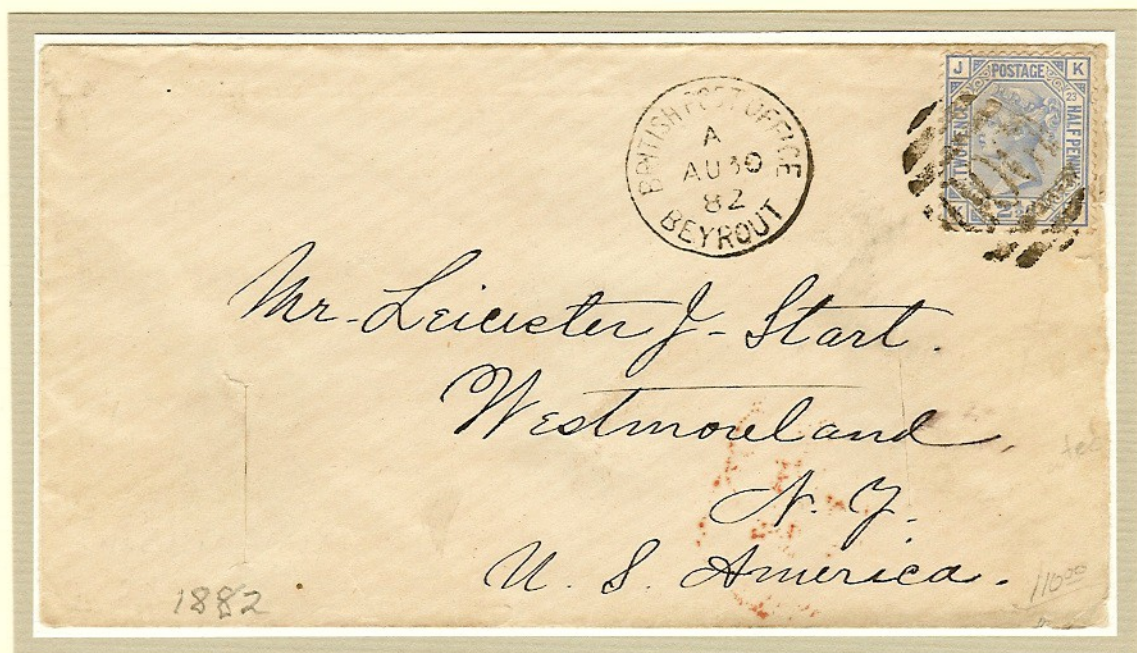
SHIPWRECK OF THE MEXICAN. On April 5, 1900 the Union-Castle liner Mexican was sunk by a collision with the British troop transport WINKFIELD in a thick fog at 2 AM in the morning. All passengers survived and most of the mail was recovered. Cover is prepaid with 1 penny stamp cancelled "G.P.O. CAPETOWN/CAPE OF GOOD HOPE. Back-stamped KENDAL AP 28 00.



BRITISH POST OFFICES ABROAD

MALTA JA 11 1871 Cover prepaid by 6d British stamp cancelled A25 of that office.

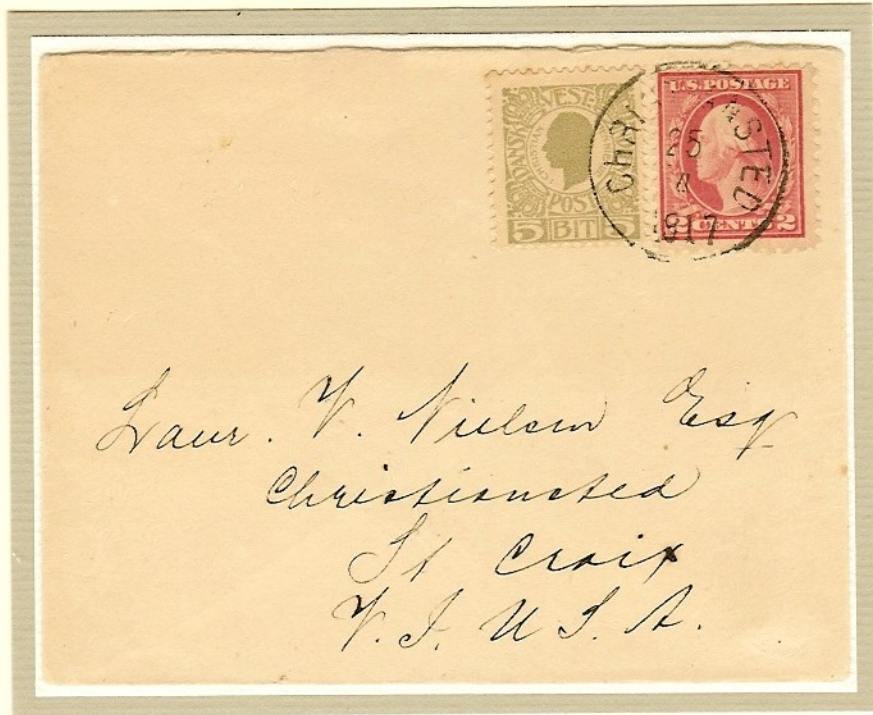
BRITISH POST OFFICE/BEYROUT/AU 30 82. British 2½d stamp paid the postage to the United States via London. Backstamped at London September 2 and arrival date September 22 1882 on arrival at New York. At this time BEYROUT was in TURKEY, but after World War I it became the capitol of the Republic of LEBANON, with the spelling changed to BEIRUT.





SOUTH AFRICAN BOER WAR 1899-1902. The "PRISONER OF WAR" cover shown above, bears the 1 pence stamp of the first issue of the ORANGE FREE STATE - later the ORANGE RIVER COLONY. Used August 3, 1900. Cover below addressed to M. Krantz, Committee of Independence of the Boers in Paris July 1900. A propaganda cover.





DANISH WEST INDIES. Cover Below originated at CHRISTIANSTED on August 14, 1896 via ST. THOMAS Sept. 15th to JAMAICA where it arrived at KINGSTON Sept. 25th and PORUS the same day, as per postmarks on reverse.

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS. After Denmark sold the D.W.I. to the United States, both D.W.I. and U.S. stamps could be used by themselves or in combination - March 31, to September 30, 1917. The cover Above was used during that period.
