



CALIFORNIA PENNY POST COMPANY.

This company was incorporated at Sacramento, California, on June 25th, 1855, by Henry L. Goodwin, Francis B. Folger and Frederick Schetter. Its object was to enter the field as independent letter carriers. There were no government carriers at this time in the cities and mining camps of California, although they had been authorized under Acts of Congress of 1851 and 1854.

The company had boxes erected and placed at corners throughout the principal cities; carriers collected mail and delivered locally and to the post office, and also received letters at the post office for delivery. Two-thirds of all the mail matter in and out of the state was at this time carried by the express companies.

Offices were established at San Francisco (#135 California Street), Sacramento, Stockton, Marysville, Benicia, Petaluma, Placerville, Fiddletown, Sonora, Shasta, &c., &c.

Stamps were prepared, as were envelopes, and distributed throughout the State at their face value. Newspaper wrappers were also prepared and sent to, at least, two papers, the New York Tribune, and the Journal of Commerce. These envelopes first bore the words "Care of the Penny Post Company". After July 4, 1855, it was changed to "To the Agent of the Penny Post Company", and later to "To the Penny Post Company for —..."

Henry L. Goodwin was the agent, superintendent, and general manager of the company.

If the matter was to go through the mails the usual United States stamps were attached.

About July 4, 1855, the Company and Mr. Charles L. Weller, Postmaster at San Francisco, diagreed as to the law relating to the transmission of such letters, &c., and a long and expensive litigation followed. The newspapers in the company's wrappers came in in lots of twenty to thirty thousand. Mr. Goodwin finally came East and secured a congressional investigation, reported in full under date of March 7, 1859, but suppressed after printing. The testimony taken now makes most interesting reading.



The Exhibit

California Penny Post Co.

The California Penny Post Company was established by Henry L. Goodwin in San Francisco on June 25, 1855. Although the latest advertisement found appeared in the October 4, 1855 issue of Prices Current & Shipping List, it seems that the company continued to deliver mail from the post office through May 1856. During their short period of operation the company issued a series of printed envelopes as well as a 5¢ adhesive stamp.

As conceived, Goodwin's plan of operation was for the company to provide mail collection and delivery services as a local post as well as in conjunction with the existing inter-city post office mails. These were the same services available in many Eastern cities by the government carrier services, but were not available from the San Francisco post office. In addition, a letter box was placed on the steamers operating from Sacramento and Stockton to San Francisco to accommodate late mails.

The menu of services and rates charged is shown in the rate schedule shown. Goodwin set up letter boxes that could serve as receptacles for the deposit of mail in four

of the major California towns (San Francisco, Sacramento, Stockton and Marysville). For the delivery of mail from the post office to street addresses, Goodwin hired messengers.

O. in one city and delivering the same in another, Transmitting by Express letters received after the Goodwin printed the frequently seen fowarder's phrase "Care of the Penny Post Company" on his first (type I) Mails are closed. mails are closed, ... City Delivery east of Taylor and Fourth streets, ... west of envelopes. Unfortunately, that text was rather difficult to read and this style envelope was soon replaced by two ----variants. The type II frank had "(To) Agent of the San Francisco City Delivery commences from the Office, 135 California street at 7 A. M., 1 P. M., and half-past 4, P. M. Penny-Post Co," prominently placed in address line. The type III frank bore the "To The Penny Post Co."

However, it was in the matter of the delivery of letters from the post office that Goodwin ran afoul of San Francisco postmaster C. L. Weller. Previously, Weller's staff had sorted most mail inbound to San Francisco businesses into post offices boxes (small unlocked boxes at \$3 per month or larger lock boxes with glass doors at \$4 per month). The monthly rental fees for such boxes was treated as a postmaster emolument. As a result of this threat to his income, postmaster Weller was disinclined to co-operative with Goodwin's scheme. Goodwin accused Weller of detaining, or mis-directing, mail addressed to the care of the Penny Post. Instead of placing such mail into the Penny Post Company box, Weller instructed clerks to place mail into the boxes of the final recipient. This, of course, deprived the recipient of the city delivery for which a fee had been paid.

Following a physical altereation on July 20, 1855 at the San Francisco post office, Goodwin sucd Weller. This was the first in an extended series of legal cases. On August 17, 1855 the post office department published a written statement that they agreed with Weller's interpretation of regulations regarding the delivery of mail. It seems however, that the department may not have been adequately informed in the matter, at least that is what Goodwin claimed. The legal cases in California wound down by the end of 1855 but Goodwin's complaint to the U.S. Congress was not resolved until 1860. From postal history evidence it appears that the company provided from the post office delivery service for mail received by them in San Francisco through May 1856.

The Penny Post Company issued franked envelopes in five major design types. Four of the major types were imprinted with multiple denominations and all exist with variants in the printed text. All of these envelopes are rare with a total of 120 genuine used examples known.

The 5¢ adhesive was used primarily on ocean mail and five of the six reported genuine uses were used in this fashiopn. For the fee of five cents, letters would be turned over to special messenger and carried, via Nicaragua, to New York City and placed in the US mails there.

The type I, paid 2¢ franks, inscribed "To The Post Office," were issued June 29, 1855. The two cent frank was intended to be used for mail deposited in one of the Penny Post street boxes in San Francisco. For the two cents fee, the Penny Post Company collected the envelope from the street hox and deposited it at the post office for onward transmission by mail. The sender was supposed to add the adhesive stamp for government postage.

LETTERS and other MAIL MATTER deposited in any Post Office, wil be DELIVERED in SAN FRANCISCO SACRAMENTO, STOCKTON, OF MI RYSVILLE, immediately on the arri val of the mails, if addressed to the care of the "PENNY POST CO." To Frances of Masse No. Empire Ostor Steel, Maryseille

The day following. I think: a letter was detained for want of full potage. It was in one of our envelops: Three costs more would have paid (full potage.) It was (subsequently) received in Marysville, and 1 sont to Marysville and obtained the envelope, (and sent it to the Postmaster General.) Have frequently seen the Penny Pest Co.'s envelopes advertised. Every letter we mailed (our selves) was with the intention of having it forwarded.

Above excerpt from "Memorial of the Penny Post Company ..." being sworn testimony given by H.L. Goodwin on Dec 15, 1855 regarding this cover. The "Filed Oct 17" on reverse is his court filing endorsement.

Goodwin presented this cover in his case against the San Francisco postmaster for "Unlawful Detention of Letters" as evidence that postmaster Weller detained this letter for postage instead of forwarding the letter as postage due.

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
