



Dated June 22, 1727. As this was On his Majesty's Special Service the letter would have been carried on a packet without charge and therefore bears no rate. The event was proclaimed from the balcony of the Old Court House.




Island cancellations or correspondence to Philadelphia are rare, as letters were frequently given to a captain as he was about to sail. This one of 1763 with straight line **BARBA DOES** is an exception.



Letter of 1764 from St. Croix was carried first to New London where postmaster rated it at 12¢wt. for overland mail and 16qr. for ship rate. Translation into currency was 5/6.





Letters before 1756 "Pr. Bordentown Stage" did not always bear handstamps.






Rate was normal 8d., but owing to depreciation it was multiplied by 40. Hence 8d. x 40 = 320. Dec. 18, 1780.



Not worth a Continental is exemplified by this \$70. Note, which had a small buying power. Postage was payable in paper money. Covers bearing any of these high rates are exceedingly hard to find.



Depreciation cover of July 1780, when postage was 40 times the 1775 rates. Hence this, at 133:8, would have been 3:8.



The Patriots besides organizing the army, were under the necessity of strengthening the old postal service opening up new routes, and putting on extra expresses. Paul Revere was one of the latter. The above document was payment by Congress for the services of John Shutterling who rode express in South Carolina in 1776. On the verso is a receipt signed the next year, 1777, by Henry Laurens, a signer of the Declaration.





In New York it was rated 6dw.









ALL KNOWN HANDSTAMPS AND A VARIETY OF
POSTAL NOTATIONS ARE SHOWN TO ILLUSTRATE
USAGE ON LETTERS SENT THRU THE MAILS, BY
POST RIDER AND STAGE BOAT OR COASTAL SHIPS.

ROYAL OR PROPRIETARY PATENT REGULATED THE MAILS IN THE COLONIES UNTIL THE PASSAGE OF THE FIRST GREAT ACT OF 1711. AMERICAN POST ROADS WERE FIRST DRAWN ON H. MOLLS MAP OF 1729.

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN WAS FIRST APPOINTED DEPUTY POSTMASTER IN 1737, AND IN 1753 HE BECAME POSTMASTER GENERAL FOR THE COLONIES, AND IN THE YEARS FOLLOWING HE WAS CONCERNED WITH THE EXPEDITION OF THE MAILS.

UNDER FRANKLIN THE SERVICE HAD BECOME NOT ONLY PROFITABLE BUT REASONABLY EFFICIENT. AS THE COLONISTS REVOLTED AGAINST THE AUTHORITY OF KING AND PARLIAMENT, THE SPIRIT OF INDEPENDENCE IS EARLY SEEN IN THE REFUSAL OF THE COLONISTS TO USE THE ESTABLISHED POSTS. GODDARDS CONSTITUTIONAL POST OFFICE TOOK OVER SO EFFECTIVELY THAT THE CROWN RIDERS HAD CEASED AFTER MAY 4, 1773. ON JULY 1 26, 1775, CONTINENTAL CONGRESS PROVIDED FOR THE REGULATION OF THE MAILS, USING THE RATES OF 1765. THEY WERE RAISED 50 PER CENT IN OCTOBER, 1777. IN DECEMBER, 1779 WAR TIME INFLATION NECESSITATED RA

CONTINUED/

RATES TWENTY TIMES THOSE OF 1765-77. AGAIN IN MAY 1780, THEY EXTENDED THE RATES. HENCE A LETTER FROM BALTIMORE TO PHILADELPHIA COST 320 PENCE, I.E. 8 PENCE-1765-75 RATE- X 20-1779 RATE- X 2-DOUBLED IN MAY 1780. IT IS NO WONDER THAT LETTERS OF REVOLUTIONARY DATE ARE SO SCARCE.

LATE IN THE YEAR 1782 CONGRESS PASSED A NEW BASIC POSTAL LAW WHICH REMAINED IN FORCE UNTIL AFTER THE CONSTITUTION WAS RATIFIED BY THE ORIGINAL THIRTEEN STATES AND THE ADMISSION OF VERMONT.

THE EXHIBITION CLOSES WITH THE ORIGINAL PRINTING OF THE ACT OF CONGRESS. ALSO FRANKED COVER OF GEORGE WASHINGTON, WHO HAD BEEN PRESIDENT WHEN THE ACT WENT INTO EFFECT, AND ANOTHER FRANKED BY TIMOTHY PICKERING WHO HAD BEEN THE POSTMASTER GENERAL IN WASHINGTONS CABINET.



