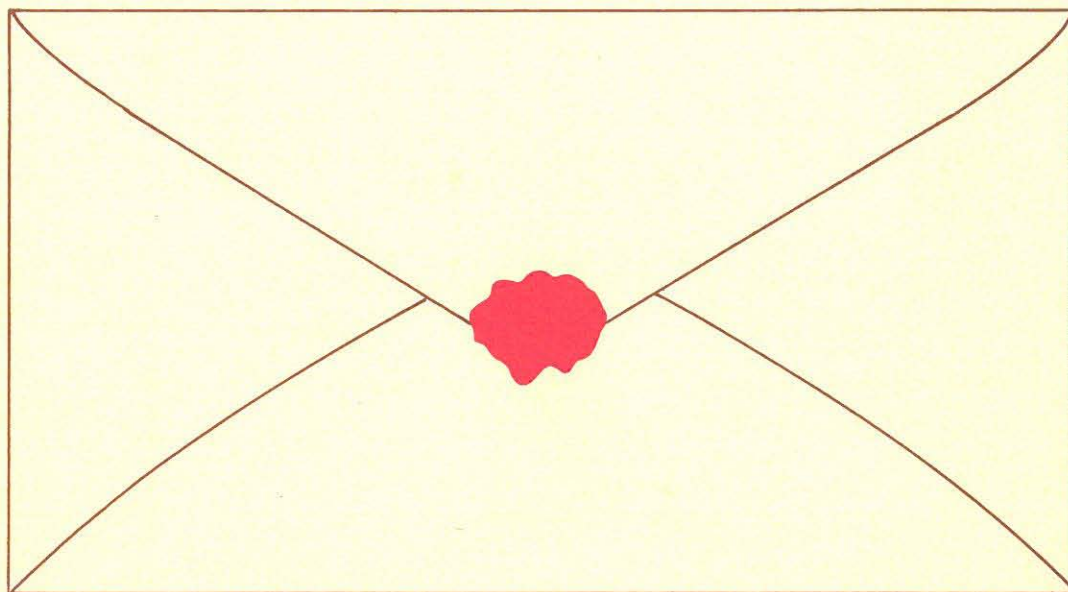

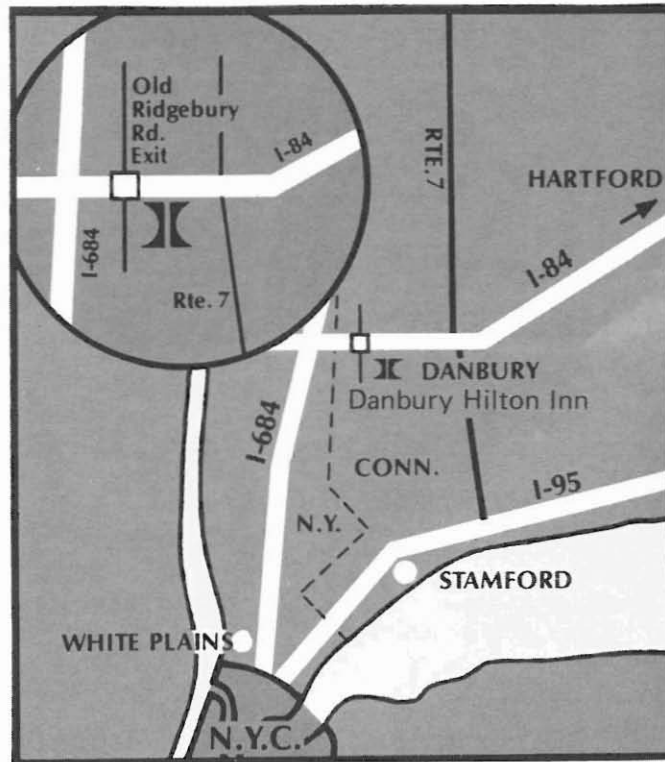

CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second high bid. All bids will be held confidential. "Buy" bids cannot be accepted. In case of tie, the first bid received prevails.
2. All bids are per lots as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and lots containing five or more items are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had the opportunity to examine them prior to the sale. We do not regard covers as defective that have slightly torn or partially missing backflap. This factor is not justification for return of a lot or lots.
4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references in time to be properly checked are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any legal action to secure payment of a delinquent account, the defaulting purchaser shall pay all legal expense incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
6. All lots are sold as genuine but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any competent, responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided that such claim is made in writing within 14 days from date of sale. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. So long as we are notified within the 14 day period that an opinion is being sought the matter will remain open until such opinion is rendered. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$50.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for full refund, and the buyer will be paid interest (at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate) for the time his funds have been on deposit with us during the extension period.
7. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, also withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller.
8. Until paid for in full all lots remain the property of Richard C. Frajola, Inc. on behalf of the seller.
9. A premium equal to 10% of the successful bid price will be added thereto and is payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. The mode of shipment shall be at our option. All forwarding charges will be added to the purchase price.
10. Upon written application lots may be sent for examination prior to the auction, condition upon being mailed back by registered mail, adequately insured, within 24 hours of receipt. The applicant is completely responsible for all lots sent for examination, and for the insurance of same against mishap, from the time of receipt until they are actually received back, and is to pay all expenses of postage and insurance. No lots can be sent for inspection within ten days of the date of sale. Photocopies of lots are available at 25¢ per copy, maximum 10 copies, and stamped self addressed return envelope required.

Condition

Condition grades mentioned in the description refer to overall appearance of the item. On covers bearing adhesives, expect normal average centering or margins for the particular issue, only when adhesive condition is above the normal will it be specifically described. File folds on folded letters that do not detract from appearance are not mentioned, nor are missing back flaps on covers if no postal markings are affected.

extremely fine—the best possible condition

very fine—pleasing appearance with all markings well struck

fine—average appearance for period, markings readable

about fine—somewhat below average, markings partially readable

Estimates

The figure which follows each lot represents a nominal estimate of what, in the auctioneers opinion, the actual value of the lot should be. Most lots are expected to fetch in excess of the estimates and bids tendered at lower figures are not likely to meet with success.

INTRODUCTION

I would personally like to invite your participation in our first public auction of postal history of the United States. Postal history is the study of established mail systems and mail services. United States postal history entails far more than the study of adhesives on cover and the recording of postmarks. It includes the study of established mail systems, Governmental and otherwise, as well as the types of service involved with the transmission of mail. Where possible I have organized this catalog according to the type of mail system utilized and by special service performed. I have also included brief notes on the particular service or on the laws regulating the system during the period.

Covers usually bear evidence of the type(s) of mail system as well as special services connected with their delivery. The proper interpretation of this evidence is, in my opinion, important to the description of postal history material. As full interpretation would prove unwieldy within the confines of an auction catalog format, I have eliminated references to information readily available by recourse to basic rate schedules, but have included other salient features.

These notes and the method of description are intended to increase awareness of areas of postal history that are generally under-appreciated. Avenues available for further research are manifold. As an example very little has been published, beyond a mere listing of handstamps, on the forwarding service provided by some hotels. An established system for handling mail certainly existed, usually in combination with the Government system, and the field deserves further investigation.

Items of significant postal history merit, even if of modest value at present, have been included throughout this sale. The relative rarity of many of these items has yet to be determined due primarily to the lack of auction documentation. As a result, designations such as rare or scarce, even where most likely warranted, have been avoided.

The refinement in the study of postal history, as defined above, is of recent origin. In many areas we are just realizing how little accurate information is available. Providing the analysis of how our postal systems worked and developed should prove to be the challenge of our generation of philatelists. It is my desire that this catalog will serve to signpost a few of these uncharted new vistas. I also hope that some of the enjoyment which I have derived from preparing this catalog will be transferred.

BRITISH COLONIAL PERIOD

Prior to the American Continental Congress Post, established in 1775, the postal system in this country was regulated by the British Colonial Postal Administration. The regionalized early mail service was gradually improved, rates were standardized in 1710, and under Benjamin Franklin the mail routes and services were expanded. Beginning in 1756 postmarking devices began to be supplied from England to the larger offices.

Lack of material, as well as information, from this period has often discouraged the student of postal history. The group which follows, in chronological order, is one of the more substantial offerings to appear on the market in many years.

AMERICAN CONTINENTAL CONGRESS PERIOD

During the period from 1775 to 1792 the postal rates and regulations for payment fluctuated frequently. Plagued by the rapid depreciation of paper currency, disruptions of mail routes caused by the war, high costs of service, and political differences the postal service amazingly survived. Covers of this period often show signs of the turmoil such as the statement of postal rates in specie (dwt., gr.) as well as local currency.

POSTAL RATES 1792 - 1799

The act of February 20, 1792 was the first, after the adoption of the Constitution, fixing rates of postage. Effective from June 1, 1792 to March 2, 1799 the new rates, given in cents rather than silver weight, reduced somewhat the previous tariffs for long distance letters. A nine tiered rate structure by distance was established.

POSTAL RATES 1799 - 1815

The act of March 2, 1799 in effect till January 31, 1815, simplified the rate structure of the previous act. A six tiered rate structure by distance was introduced. Mail service was greatly expanded during this period, steam boat mail was started on the Hudson River, and the need for extended mail service in the West was heightened by the necessities of the War of 1812.

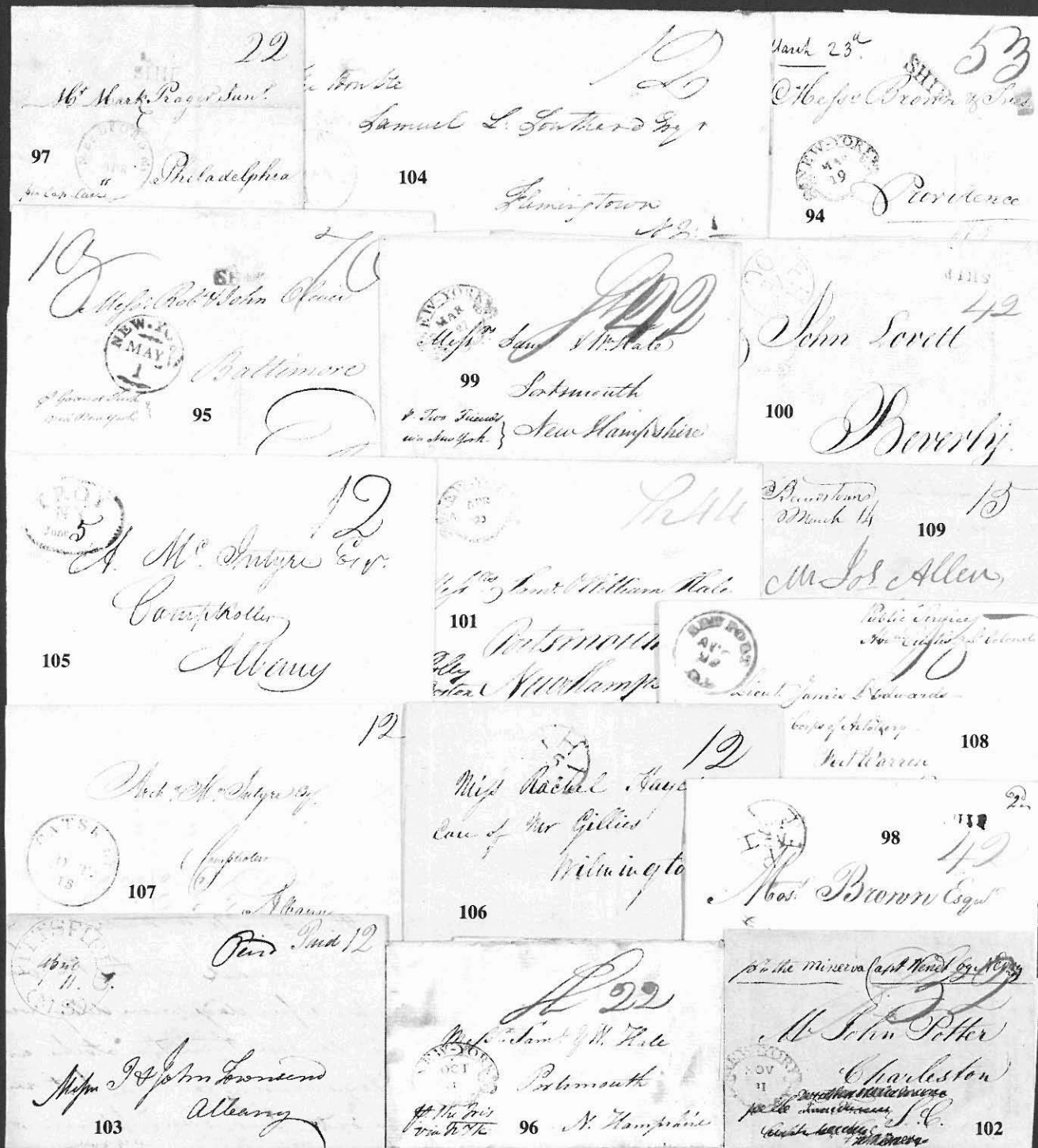

50% WAR SURCHARGE RATES

By an act of December 23, 1814, effective from February 1, 1815 to March 31, 1816, the previous rates of postage were increased 50 percent. The hope was that the increased revenues would help replenish the war depleted Treasury, the effect on business was disastrous and the scheme was quickly abandoned.

Covers showing the surcharge rates are often overlooked by the postal historian. They are evidence, however, of a failed attempt at indirect taxation. The Government policy to facilitate and encourage correspondence, re-enforced during the repeal hearings, was to have a profound impact on future postal expansion.

NEWSPAPER, PERIODICAL & PRINTED CIRCULAR RATES

What was to be classified as second class mail in 1863 had previously been the subject of many postal regulations. Many of these laws tried to define what constituted printed matter. After the simplification of letter postage rates in 1845 a five tier rated structure was introduced for printed matter in 1851. These rates were eliminated sixteen months later.

CARRIERS

The carrier service in this country dates back at least to 1689 when the postmaster of Boston was instructed "to receive all letters and delivery them at 1d." (see lot #2). In 1794 the law allowed the penny post to collect 2 cents for the delivery of a letter. Generally a letter would not be turned over to the carrier for two days unless there were instructions for immediate delivery. These fees were usually paid in cash so little evidence survives. Carrier fees fluctuated from city to city, and as the competition necessitated, from 1836 to 1860. A uniform 1 cent carrier fee for "to the mails" and "from the mails" existed from 1860 to 1863. The rates were misunderstood generally. Carrier delivery fee could not be prepaid.

Most covers which show evidence of carrier service date from 1860 to 1863 and show 1 cent extra being paid for "to the mails." The group which follows includes several rare "from the mails" usages.

ADVERTISED MAIL MARKINGS

By an act passed in 1825 letters that were not called for were to be advertised in a local newspaper or lists posted in public places. The cost of 2 cents was added to the postage. After 1836 advertisements of letters could be placed in more than one newspaper as long as the total cost did not exceed 4 cents. In 1851 the advertised letter fee was set at 1 cent.

Many advertised covers do not show evidence of this extra fee although some show date of advertisement.

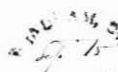

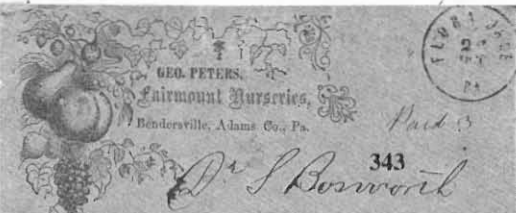

Numerous types of private companies handled mail outside the Government control or auspices. The tradition for such carriage of mails dates back to the early forwarding agents of the Colonial days. Express companies, local mail posts, and forwarders continued to thrive in spite of the Government's attempt to close out competition. This competition was directly responsible for lower postal rates.

HOTEL HANDSTAMPS

During the 1840's and early 1850's several hotels applied handstamps to letters as advertising or to show a mail service performed. The extent of service varied from the taking of guest's letters to the nearest Post Office to carrying mail to another city. That the Post Office was concerned with the hotels' infringement on their monopoly is evident from the Reports Of The Postmaster General. In the 1841 report appears "It is a notorious fact our principal hotels are the common receptacles of letters . . . , and I am utterly at a loss to devise a remedy for this evil." and then again later "I understand that a box is kept at Howard's for the reception of letters for places on the Hudson;."

The following lots are from the collection formed by Ben Newman and served as the basis for the listing in the A.S.C. Catalog. Much further work is needed to determine the extent of mail service and fees charged for each listed hotel. These markings are all scarce and are rarely offered.

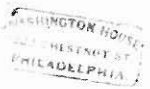

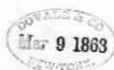

Mail given to these agents was processed and cancelled with postmarks that usually have an indication such as R.R., R.P.O., or Mail Route. Some of these route markings were used on combination land and water routes and are listed with the inland waterways.

All of these markings are scarce and many are rare.

BALTIMORE & OHIO R.R. STATION AGENTS

Beginning in the late 1850's railway station agents began to secure appointments as Postmasters at some of the small towns along the railroad. Since Postmasters at smaller offices supplied their own cancelling devices the result was that many of these appointees used their ticket daters as postmarking devices. This practice died as separate post offices were opened.

These station agent markings are all relatively scarce and usages with 1857 issue stamps are rare. The Civil War period is especially interesting as a result of frequent interruptions in services caused by Confederate raids. The collection which follows includes several fine examples including many from the Wyer collection.

Intermission

WATERWAY MAIL MARKINGS

The carriage of mail on inland waterways increased dramatically from 1800 to 1860. Several types of distinctive markings were applied to letters posted by boat.

Route agents, as employees of the Post Office, were used on some of the waterway routes. As with their railway counterparts distinctive postmarks were used and no additional fees were charged.

On vessels with Government mail carrying contracts a letter posted on board was handled as way mail subject to an additional fee. Upon delivery at port of arrival it was marked "way" and postmarked.

On vessels without Government contracts a letter posted on board was delivered to the Post Office at arrival port. There it was postmarked with "Steam" or "Steamboat" generally used in addition to the townmark. The regulations regarding additional fees fluctuated.

Name of boat markings were frequently used in conjunction with the three classes of waterway mail discussed above, as well as on bills of lading that could be transmitted without postal charge after 1852.

It is occasionally difficult to classify way usages as to type (post rider, stage, canal, railway, or boat) and frequently Steam, Steamboat and Way markings were used interchangeably.

WAY MAIL MARKINGS

Prior to 1863 a fee of one cent was levied on mail given to contract mail carriers enroute. As modes of transportation changed so did the frequency of occurrence of the types of way mail. In the earlier period most way mail was stage or post rider, later with the increased use of steamboats, most way mail was waterway. Canal and railway way mail usages are rare.

After 1863 way markings were generally used as indication of mail that was posted on non-contract carriers. Double postal rates were charged on such mail.

From 1816 to 1861 letters addressed to port of entry were charged 6 cents and from 1861, 5 cents. After 1863 all private ship letters were charged with double postage. DEPRECIATED CURRENCY MARKINGS

Beginning in 1863 the value of specie fell in relation to the value of paper currency. As the Post Office Foreign mail contracts required payment in specie the Department, to avoid a substantial loss, introduced special rate markings for inbound, unpaid letters. These usually stated the rate for payment in silver as well as for payment in notes, based on values that fluctuated constantly.
