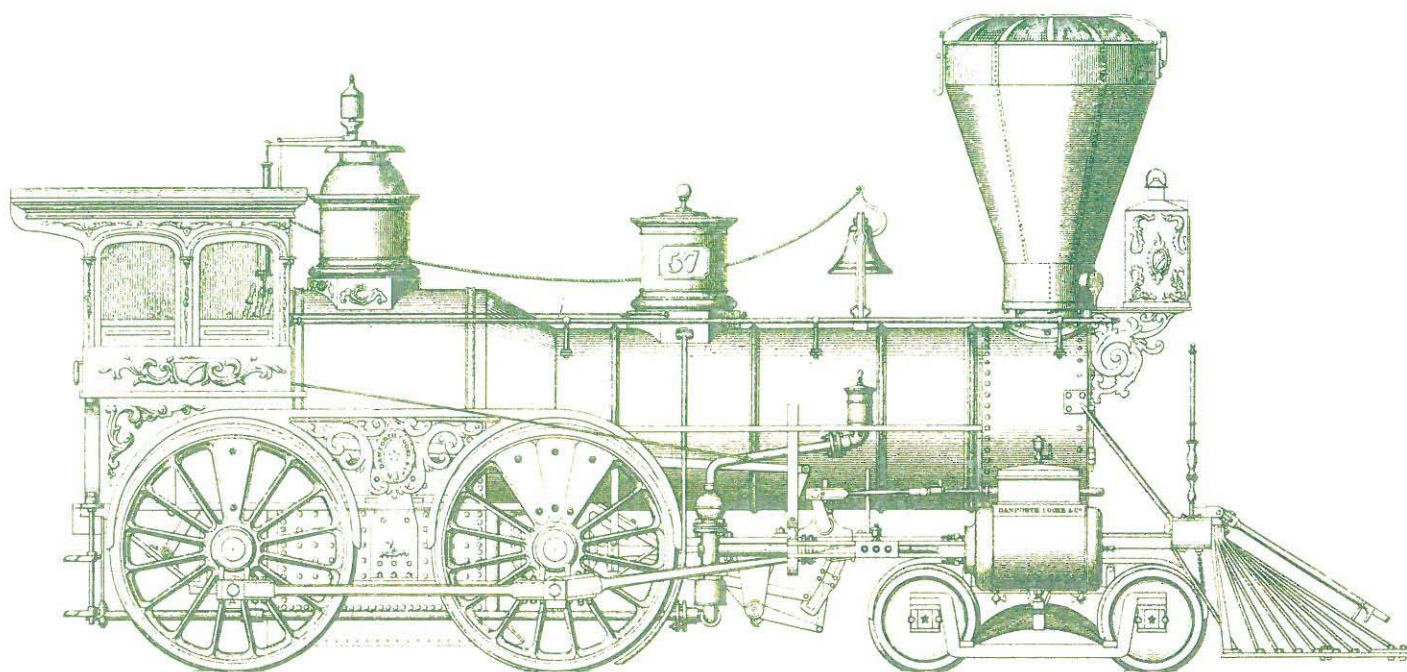

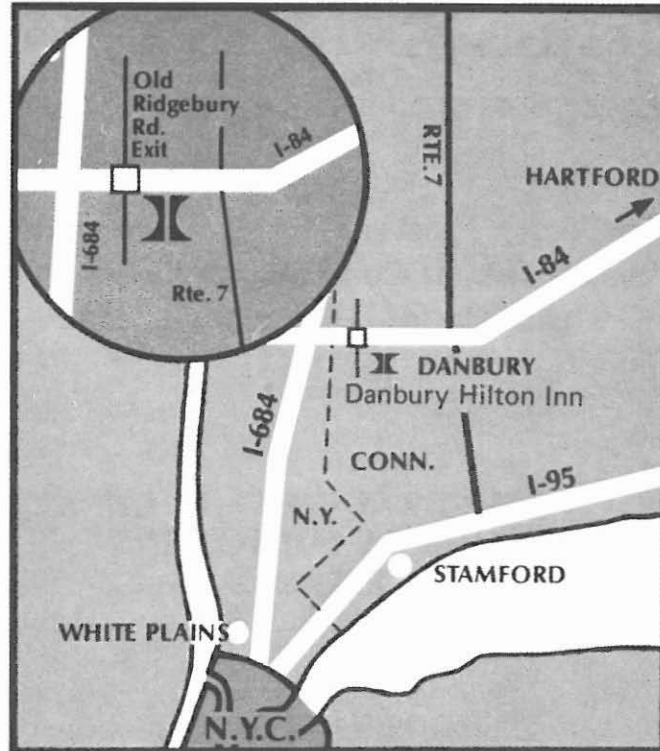

CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second high bid. All bids will be held confidential. "Buy" bids cannot be accepted. In case of tie, the first bid received prevails.
2. All bids are per lots as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and lots containing five or more items are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had the opportunity to examine them prior to the sale. We do not regard covers as defective that have slightly torn or partially missing backflap. This factor is not justification for return of a lot or lots.
4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references in time to be properly checked are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any legal action to secure payment of a delinquent account, the defaulting purchaser shall pay all legal expense incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
6. All lots are sold as genuine but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any competent, responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided that such claim is made in writing within 14 days from date of sale. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. So long as we are notified within the 14 day period that an opinion is being sought the matter will remain open until such opinion is rendered. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$50.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for full refund, and the buyer will be paid interest (at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate) for the time his funds have been on deposit with us during the extension period.
7. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, also withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller.
8. Until paid for in full all lots remain the property of Richard C. Frajola, Inc. on behalf of the seller.
9. A premium equal to 10% of the successful bid price will be added thereto and is payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. The mode of shipment shall be at our option. All forwarding charges will be added to the purchase price.
10. Upon written application lots may be sent for examination prior to the auction, condition upon being mailed back by registered mail, adequately insured, within 24 hours of receipt. The applicant is completely responsible for all lots sent for examination, and for the insurance of same against mishap, from the time of receipt until they are actually received back, and is to pay all expenses of postage and insurance. No lots can be sent for inspection within ten days of the date of sale. Photocopies of lots are available at 25¢ per copy, maximum 10 copies, and stamped self addressed return envelope required.

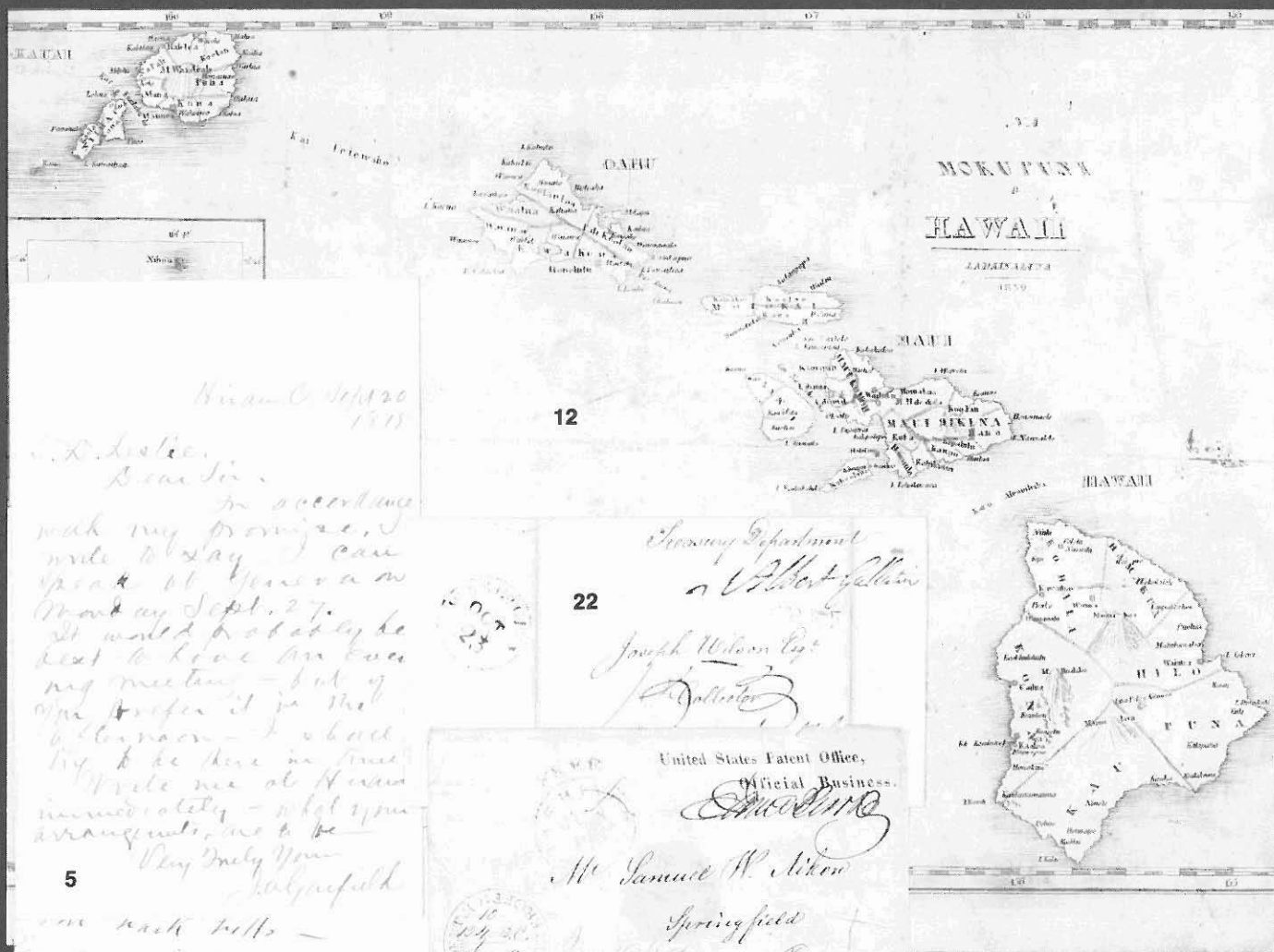

- 12 **[Map of Hawaii]**, "Na Mokupuni o Hawaii, Lahainaluna 1839" imprint on linen backed engraved map (15½"x10½") of the Hawaiian Islands, "Na Kapohoni i Kahai" at foot, believed to have been printed at Lorrin Andrews Missionary School, some very minor internal wrinkles Est. 400-500
- 13 **Isaac Hull**, L.S., 1 p, 4 to, "U. Ship Ohio off Marseilles, June 15, 1839" to an Assistant Surgeon ordering him to report to the U.S.S. - 15 **David Porter**, Naval Officer, L.S., U.S. Frigate Essex, Navy Yard Brooklyn, June 6, 1812 to Paul Hamilton, Sec. of Navy requesting a surgeon continue on his crew, 7 line autograph note of Paul Hamilton referring the matter to Com. Rodgers, splitting fold at top away from both signatures Est. 100-150
- 16 **Franklin D. Roosevelt**, A.L.S., 2 p, 8 vo on Warm Spring, Georgia imprint stationery, Mar. 15, 1928, to "Dear Doc" (Basl O'Connor) former law partner and fellow incorporator of the Foundation, "Here is a very nice little surprise...a gift of \$25,000...from Edsel Ford....We are (last month) breaking a little better than even on our operating costs..." recipient's stamped docket and two punch holes at left, with portrait Est. 200-250
- 17 **Ship Captain's Correspondence**, 1834/1850, group of 93 folded letters, correspondence of Capt. George Drew and Capt. William B. Drew, primarily letters on shipping matters between the two brothers from Duxbury, Mass., good content regarding various ships incl. "Rambler, Aldebaron, and Lebanon," various pmks incl. Steam Boat, One Cent of Charleston and ship, fine group Est. 500-700

PRINTED MATTER RATES

What was to be classified as second class mail in 1863 had previously been the subject of many postal regulations. Many of these laws tried to define what constituted printed matter. After the simplification of letter postage rates in 1845 a five tier rated structure was introduced for printed matter in 1851. These rates were eliminated sixteen months later.

HUDSON RIVER MAIL

The Hudson River was the proving ground not only for the first commercially successful steamboats in the United States but also for the first transportation of mail by steamboats.

Prior to Robert Fulton's first steamboat run on the Hudson River in the "North River Steam Boat" on August 17, 1807 all mail carried by water on the Hudson River was carried in sailing sloops. The regular contract mails were transported by stage coach. Two years later the first ship mail appears on the Hudson River. These were marked and rated as regular ship mail and may have been carried by either sloop or steamboat.

Regular contract mail service by steamboat began April 15, 1815 and no ship mail usage are recorded after that date. Mail carried under steamboat contract was marked and rated the same as it has been under stage coach contract. However, a new class of mail matter begins to appear in September, 1815. These letters bear manuscript "B" markings applied at Albany and were used to distinguish loose letters received from a boat, sloop or steamboat, captain to which the postmaster had to pay a fee. These letters were rated the same as if carried by land or under steamboat contract. As steamboats became the dominant mode of transportation these "B" markings were superceded by "Steamboat" handstamps for the same class of mail.

The first route agent markings used on the Hudson River are the "U.S. Express Mail" postmarks known from 1842 to 1846 and treated separately. These were superceded by the "Hudson Riv. Mail N.Y." agent postmark and the scarce "Hudson River Mail N.Y." marking. The latter is a steam route agent marking prior to October, 1851 and after that date is a railroad agent marking applied on the Hudson River R.R.

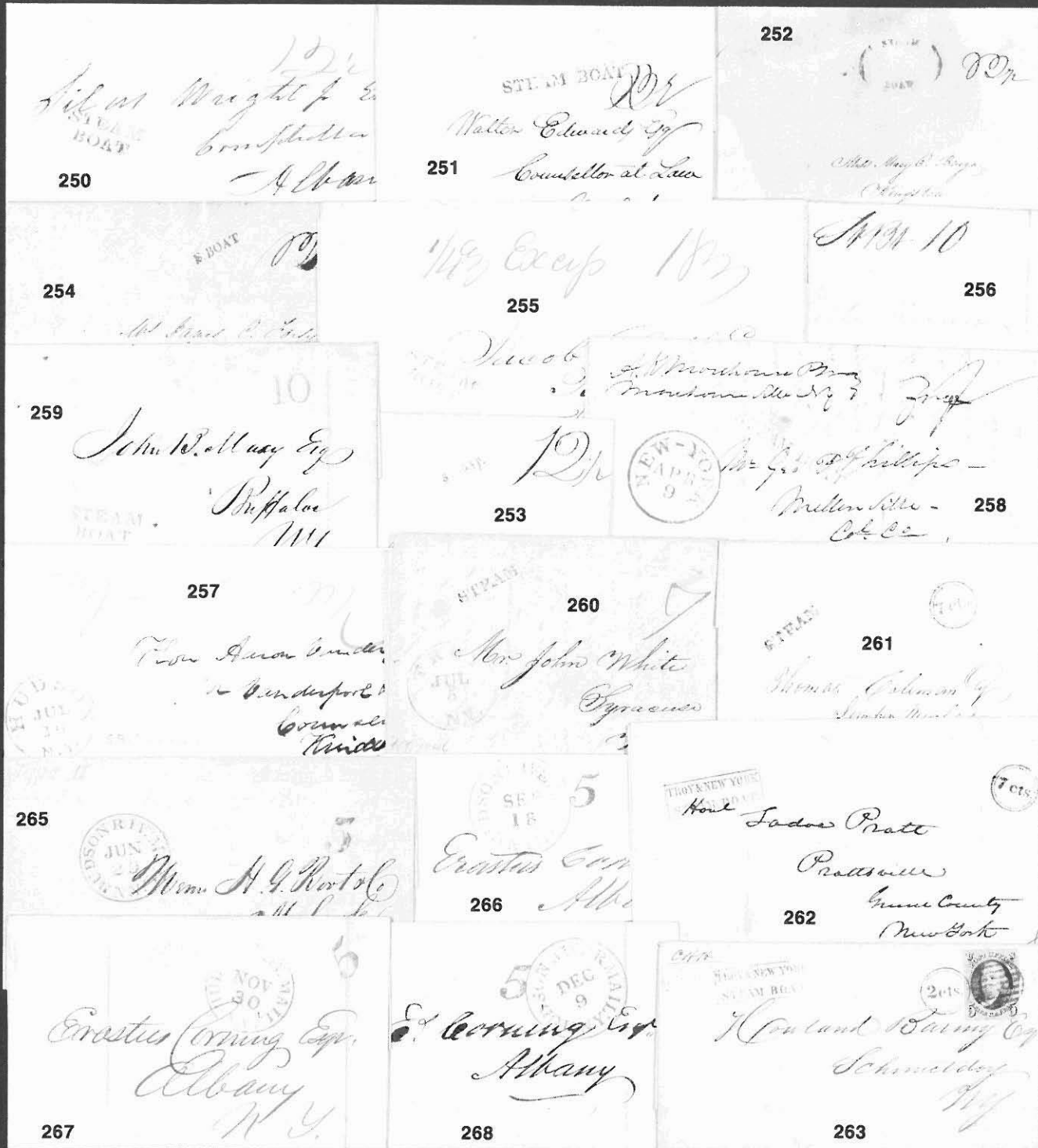

U.S. EXPRESS MAIL

The U.S. Express Mail began in August, 1842 as a means for the Post Office to improve service on routes where competition from the private express companies was strong. Agents were appointed to receive and handle mail brought to the contract steamboat (in the case of mail handled between Albany and New York on the Hudson River) after the regular mails had been closed but before departure. These agents travelled with the contract boats and could receive letters, prepaid or collect, handed to them on route as well. Two express mail markings are known to have been used by the route agents on the Hudson River steamboats. The "U.S. Express Mail N.Y." cds with "N.York" in the center for mail handled on the northbound trip and with "Albany" in the center on the southbound trip. Similar markings were used by the route agents on the railroads but those which follow were applied by steamboat agents.
