

CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second high bid. All bids will be held confidential. "Buy" bids cannot be accepted. In case of tie, the first bid received prevails.
- 2. All bids are per lots as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
- 3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and lots containing five or more items are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had the opportunity to examine them prior to the sale. We do not regard covers as defective that have slightly torn or partially missing backflap. This factor is not justification for return of a lot or lots.
- 4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references in time to be properly checked are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
- 5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any legal action to secure payment of a delinquent account, the defaulting purchaser shall pay all legal expense incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
- 6. All lots are sold as genuine but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any competent, responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided that such claim is made in writing within 14 days from date of sale. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. So long as we are notified within the 14 day period that an opinion is being sought the matter will remain open until such opinion is rendered. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$50.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for full refund, and the buyer will be paid interest (at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate) for the time his funds have been on deposit with us during the extension period.
- 7. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, also withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller.
- 8. Until paid for in full all lots remain the property of Richard C. Frajola, Inc. on behalf of the seller.



IN CONGRESS.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 3, 1776.

INSTRUCTIONS to the COMMANDERS of Private Ships or Vefiels of War. which fhall have Commiffions or Letters of Marque and Reprifal, authorifing them to make Captures of British Veffels and Cargoes.

I. Market Constraints of Great-Brinain, a stack, fubdue, and take all Ships and other Veffels belonging to the Inhabitumes of Great-Brinain, on the Hiph Seas, or between high-water and low-water Mirks, except Ships and Veffels bringing Perfons who intend to fettle and relide in the United Colonier, or bringing Arms, Annunition or Wallke Stores to the faid Colonier, for the Ule of facis linhabitumes thereof as are Friends to the American Confe, which you fault fuffer to pair immolified, the Commanders thereof permitting a pence-able Search, and giving faitsfactory Information of the Contents of the Ladings, and Definitions of the Voyages.

IT.

You may, by Force of Arms, attack, fubdue, and take all Ships and other VelEts whatfoeser carrying Soldiers, Arms, Gun-powder, Ammanition, Provisions, or any other contraband Goods, to any of the British Armites or Ships of War employed against their Colonies.

III.

You that bring fuch Ships and Veffels as you fhull take, with their Guns, Rigging, Tackle, Apparel, For-niture and Ladings, to fome convenient Port or Ports of the United Colonies, that Proceedings may thereupon be had in due Form before the Courts which are or fault be there appointed to hear and determine Caufes civil and maritime.

IV. IV. You or one of your Chief Officers thall bring or fend the Mather and Pilot and one or more principal Perform or Performs of the Company of every Ship or Velfel by you raken, as ison after the Capture as may be, to the Judge or Judges of inci Court an aforefaid, to be examined apon Oath, and tarke Anfert to the Interrogatories which may be propounded toxehing the Interest of a Property of the Shipo Velfel and her Lading; and at the time True you shall deliver or canfe to be delivered to the Judge or Judges, all Paties, Sen-Briefs, Charter-Pariles, Bills of Lading, Cockets, Letters, and other Documents and Writings found on Board, proving the faid Papers by the Affaivatio yourfell, or of fome other Perion preferate the Capture, to be produced as they were received, without Fraud, Addition, Subduction, or Emboralement.

keep and preferve every Ship or Vefiel and Cargo by you taken, until they fhall by Sentence of a dy authorifed be adjudged lawful Prize, and felling, foulling, wafting, or diminifying the fame or Bulk thereof, nor fuffering any fuch Thing to be done.

any of your Officers or Crew shall, in cold Blood, kill or maint, or, by Torture or otherwife, imanly, and contrary to common Ufage and the Practice of civilized Nations in War, treat any Per-us farguized in the Ship or Veffel you shall take, the Offender shall be feverely punished.

by all convenient Opportunities, fend to Congrefs written Accounts of the Captures you fault the Number and Names of the Captives, Copies of your Journal from Time to Time, and Intelli-t may occur of he different concerning the Defigns of the Enemy, and the Definations, Motions, es of their Fleets and Armies.

VIII, I, at the leaft, of your whole Company thall be Land-Men.

IX.

nor ranfome any Prificaers or Captives, but thall difpole of them in fach Manner as the Congrefs, not fitting in the Colony whither they fhall be brought, as the General Alfembly, Convention, or 'ommittee of Safety of fach Colony fhall dired.

X. obferve all fach further Inftructions as Congress shall hereafter give in the Premises, when you shall XI.

I do any Thing contrary to their leftroffions, or to others hereafter to be given, or willingly feffer > he done, you fhall not only forfeit you: Committien, and be liable to an Action for Breach of the your Bond, but be refpontible to the Party grieved for Danisges fulfained by fuch Mal-verfation.


WATERBURY FANCY CANCELS

Between 1865 and 1890, John W. Hill, a clerk, and later the postmaster of Waterbury, Conn. created some of the most interesting and unusual cancellation devises used in this country. The beauty and variety of these markings have captured the imagination of philatelists since they were first studied by Ray Sanborne in 1918 and have been the subject of several articles and books since. They represent what is probably the best example of the folk art tradition in postal history.

The following group of Waterbury fancy cancels have been consigned by a New England Institution. They are from a recently discovered correspondence addressed to Henry S. Chase and include all the Waterbury fancy cancels found. The Institution elected to retain the original letters. Year dates included in the description are in some cases derived from those enclosures.

This correspondence is offerred in chronological order. A summary and cross reference by cancel type follows. The cancel nomenclature and catalog numbers are from The Waterbury Cancellations 1865-1890 by the late Paul C. Rohloff, published by The Collectors Club of Chicago.






