

CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second high bid. All bids will be held confidential. "Buy" bids cannot be accepted. In case of tie, the first bid received prevails.
- 2. All bids are per lots as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
- 3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and lots containing five or more items are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had the opportunity to examine them prior to the sale. We do not regard covers as defective that have slightly torn or partially missing backflap. This factor is not justification for return of a lot or lots.
- 4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references in time to be properly checked are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
- 5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any legal action to secure payment of a delinquent account, the defaulting purchaser shall pay all legal expense incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
- 6. All lots are sold as genuine but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any competent, responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided that such claim is made in writing within 14 days from date of sale. CALIFORNIA POSTAL HISTORY

The treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2, 1848, included the transfer of California from Mexico to the United States. Only a few letters bearing postal markings from the Spanish period are known (an example is listed under Los Angeles.) During the period prior to September 7, 1850, when California was admitted as a State, there were temporary local governments and military governments. A tremendous influx of people followed the discovery of gold in 1848, estimated at 80,000 for 1849 alone. The U.S. postal system began in California with the arrival of Agent William Van Voorhees in San Francisco on February 28, 1849.

Postal history of the period prior to 1869 is especially rich because of the diversity of mail handling methods with the independent mail handlers providing much needed service. These covers and letters continue to stimulate the imagination of postal historians. The romance attached to the gold rush and the pony express is undeniable. For further information the reader is referred to the fine new book "Letters Of Gold" by Jesse Coburn, published by The U.S. Philatelic Classics Society, Inc. and The Philatelic Foundation, Inc. and available from them or directly from us at \$50., postage prepaid. Many of the covers offerred are illustrated in this book.







CONTRACT MAIL ROUTES TO CALIFORNIA

The United States Government tried several different routes to get mail safely to and from California. The ocean route via Panama was the first to receive a contract and continued to be the preferred route until the railroad was completed in 1869. Additional contract routes, mostly overland, were also established as needed. For mail to be carried on one of these routes the sender had to specify the route desired on the cover or it would be sent via Panama

THE VIA PANAMA ROUTE

The most important contract mail route from California was the route connecting San Francisco with New York by steamships via Panama (see map on page 55). The Pacific Mail Steamship Company held the contract for mail on the Pacific Ocean while The United States Mail Steamship Company held the contract for mail on the Atlantic side. Route agents were assigned to the steamers and used the distinctive route markings. The majority of mail from California prior to 1863 was carried on this route and included all letters not specifically endorsed to be carried over other routes. LAWS LINE OF PACIFIC STEAMERS

In 1850 George Law began to operate a line of steamers between San Francisco and Panama. Although Law did not have a mail contract, the San Francisco postmaster allowed mail to be carried on his ship if specifically endorsed. This practice was soon banned by the Postmaster General. Distinctive handstamps were used by the steamers Columbus and Isthmus.

THE BUTTERFIELD OVERLAND MAIL ROUTE

In September, 1858 the first overland, through mail route under Government contract was opened. Connecting San Francisco and Los Angeles with St. Louis and Memphis, via a southern route (see map on page 56), the mail was to be carried by the Overland Mail Company in 30 days. In early 1861 service was interrupted due to Indian troubles and Confederate forces in Texas. By July, 1861 the Overland Mail Company was fulfilling the mail contract over a northern route (see map on page 57) along the old California Trail. For a letter to be carried on the Butterfield Route the sender had to inscribe "Via Overland Mail" or the equivalent on the cover.



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THE CENTRAL OVERLAND ROUTE

From 1850 the Post Office Department issued a series of contracts for carrying mail over portions of the California Trail (see map on page 57) but no through service was established until Butterfield shifted to the northern route in 1861. George Chorpenning held a contact for mails from Placerville to Salt Lake City from 1851 until 1860. Other contract holders included John Hockaday (Salt Lake City to St. Joseph, Mo., 1858-1859) and William Russell who took over the Chorpenning route in 1860.

THE VIA TEHUANTEPEC ROUTE

In June, 1858 a mail contract was awarded to the Louisiana Tehuantepec Company to provide twice monthly mail service between New Orleans and San Francisco by water and across the Mexican isthmus (see map on page 58). The route operated only between October 1, 1858 and September 27, 1859 and handled very little mail. Letters had to be inscribed "Via Tehuantepec" for carriage over this route.

THE SAN DIEGO-SAN ANTONIO ROUTE

On July 1, 1857 contract mail service began on the "Jackass" Route connecting San Diego and San Antonio, Texas (see map on page 59). Mules were used to convey the mail over much of the route through desolate country. The San Diego to Fort Yuma leg was dropped in 1860 and the balance of the route was abandoned in 1861 after having carried very little mail. Letters had to be inscribed "Via San Diego" or equivalent to be carried on this route.



CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT MAILS


A large quantity of California mail was carried by the independent expresses, steamship companies without Government contracts, and local mail companies. The most important independent mail routes to the East were Via Nicaragua and the Overland route followed by the Pony Express. Letters usually are postmarked at the post office where they entered the mails rather than at the city of origin.

CALIFORNIA LOCAL POSTS

Several private local posts flourished in California's larger cities, especially San Francisco. These posts took mail from drop points to the post office or the steamers, delivered mail from the post office to local addresses or handled purely local letters completely out of the Government mails. The California Penny Post Company, started by H.L. Goodwin in June, 1855, is probably the most famous of these companies. He had established offices in nine cities before being forced to close after only about one year.

THE VIA NICARAGUA ROUTE

The route by steamer from San Francisco to New York via the isthmus of Nicaragua (see map page 60) was a non contract route established by Cornelius Vanderbilt as a challenge to the two steamship monopolies. Vanderbilt's Independent Line began operating in July, 1851. Mail carried without contract over this route frequently bore "propaganda" handstamps such as 'Via Nicaragua Ahead Of The Mails" and soon other competing lines began carrying mails without contract.



SAN FRANCISCO LETTER BAG OPERATORS

In San Francisco several individuals operated a service for delivery of a customer's mail to any steamer on it's sailing date. Among the more famous of these were J.W. Sullivan, G.L. Leland and Charles Kimball (The Noisy Carrier). The markings employed by them usually included the "Via Nicaragua" reference if the letter was to go by a non contract steamer.

THE PONY EXPRESS

The Pony Express is undoubtedly the most famous independent mail route in United States history. Started by The Central Overland California & Pike's Peak Express Company on April 3, 1860, the route was scheduled to cover the 1,960 miles between San Francisco and St. Joseph, Mo. (see map on page 57) in eight days. Until the completion of the trans-continental telegraph on October 24, 1861, the Pony Express, by then under the control of The Overland Mail Company, provided a much needed news service.

THE PERIOD FROM APRIL 3 TO JULY 6, 1860

The first period of Pony Express service was especially difficult and very little mail was handled. The first trip from San Francisco to St. Joseph, Mo. took only ten days but by May the Piute and Shoshone Indian Wars caused delays and service interruptions. Rates for Pony Express service were \$5 per half ounce for letters to be carried over the entire route with any telegraphic charges extra. Letters had to be enclosed in stamped envelopes to comply with the Government regulations for independent mails.







THE PERIOD FROM JULY 7, 1860 TO APRIL 14, 1861

The Pony Express service resumed from Sacramento to the East on July 7, 1860. Constant changes took place in the service during the following nine months. The termini of the route travelled by Pony came closer together with the extension of the telegraph lines. In August, 1860 a rate of \$2.50 per quarter ounce was announced. In March, 1861 the Overland Mail Company contract route was moved to the Central Route used by the Pony Express.





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THE PERIOD FROM APRIL 15, 1861 TO JUNE 30, 1861

On April 15, 1861 announcement was made that Wells, Fargo & Co. would act as agents for the receipt of Pony Express mail in San Francisco to connect with the Overland Mail Company's Pony Express at Placerville. The Central Overland California & Pike's Peak Express Company retained the portion of the route between Salt Lake City and St. Joseph. The Pony portion of the route West of Salt Lake City was under the control of The Overland Mail Company which had the lucrative regular mail contract. Commencing April 15, 1861 a new \$2 rate per half ounce was announced and adhesive stamps were issued for the Pony Express service. Letters were to be enclosed in ten cent government envelopes.

THE PERIOD FROM JULY 1, TO OCTOBER 24, 1861

On July 1, 1861 the Pony Express rate was reduced to \$1 per half ounce, and new adhesives issued. Wells, Fargo & Co., acting as San Francisco agents, requested letters to be enclosed in their franked ten cent envelopes. The telegraph lines were completed on October 24, 1861 and the Pony service soon ended.

THE VIRGINIA CITY PONY EXPRESS

The Virginia City Pony Express connected San Francisco and Virginia City, Nevada (see map on page 61). It was completely owned and operated by Wells, Fargo & Co. as an independent mail route. Established in August, 1862 it was in operation until March 2, 1865. Special adhesives were issued for the service, the 25 cent red being used only for the last eight months of the service.



MAP OF THE BUTTERFIELD OVERLAND MAIL ROUTE




MAP OF THE CENTRAL OVERLAND AND PONY EXPRESS MAIL ROUTE

MAP OF THE SAN DIEGO TO SAN ANTONIO MAIL ROUTE




MAP OF THE ROUTE VIA NICARAGUA
