

#### CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. Lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second high bid. All bids will be held confidential. "Buy" bids cannot be accepted. In case of tie, the first bid received prevails.
- 2. All bids are per lots as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
- 3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and lots containing five or more items are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had the opportunity to examine them prior to the sale. We do not regard covers as defective that have slightly torn or partially missing backflap. This factor is not justification for return of a lot or lots.
- 4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references in time to be properly checked are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
- 5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any legal action to secure payment of a delinquent account, the defaulting purchaser shall pay all legal expense incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
- 6. ## 50% WAR SURCHARGE RATES

By an act of December 23, 1814, effective from February 1, 1815 to March 31, 1816, the previous rates of postage were increased 50 percent. The hope was that the increased revenues would help replenish the war depleted Treasury, the effect on business was disastrous and the scheme was quickly abandoned.

Covers showing the surcharge rates are often overlooked by the postal historian. They are evidence, however, of a failed attempt at indirect taxation. The Government policy to facilitate and encourage correspondence, re-enforced during the repeal hearings, was to have a profound impact on future postal expansion.




## INDEPENDENT MAIL SERVICES

Numerous types of private companies handled mail outside the Government control or auspices. The tradition for such carriage of mails dates back to the early forwarding agents of the Colonial days. Express companies, local mail posts, and forwarders continued to thrive in spite of the Government's attempt to close out competition. This competition was directly responsible for lower postal rates.

	WATERWAY MAIL MARKINGS	
	The carriage of mail on inland waterways increased dramatically from 1800 to 1860. Several types of distinctive markings were applied to letters posted by boat.  Route agents, as employees of the Post Office, were used on some of the waterway routes. As with their railway counterparts distinctive postmarks were used and no additional fees were charged.  On vessels with Government mail carrying contracts a letter posted on board was handled as way mail subject to an additional fee. Upon delivery at port of arrival it was marked "way" and postmarked.  On vessels without Government contracts a letter posted on board was delivered to the Post Office at arrival port. There it was postmarked with "Steam" or "Steamboat" generally used in addition to the townmark. The regulations regarding additional fees fluctuated.  Name of boat markings were frequently used in conjunction with the three classes of waterway mail discussed above, as well as on bills of lading that could be transmitted without postal charge after 1852.


#### PORT OF ENTRY SHIP MAIL MARKINGS

From 1799 to 1863 letters that arrived on private ships, except those addressed to port of entry, were charged 2 cents in addition to inland postage. From 1816 to 1861 letters addressed to port of entry were charged 6 cents and from 1861, 5 cents. After 1863 all private ship letters were charged with double postage. All mail was processed at first port of arrival.

## **CIVIL WAR LETTERS**

356	Nye Family Correspondence, large group of letter and original covers from the 1850-1865 period of this famous Maine family. 


