



- Boston to Philadelphia: 292 miles: 7dwt
- Total: 8dwt 8gr
- Pennsylvania Local Currency of 3sh/6p applied at the Philadelphia Post Office.
- 8dwt 8gr = $25p \times 1.67$ (inflation factor) = 42p or 3/6





- Newport to New London: 51 Miles: 1dwt 8gr
- Double Rate: 2dwt 16 gr
- Additional for Way: 16gr
- Total: 3dwt 8gr
- Letter by passed the Newport Post Office and handed to Post Rider who brought the letter to New London Post Office.



- Boston to New London: 131 Miles; 2dwt 16gr
- After being received at the New London Post Office, an private post carried the letter to Lebanon.
- Connecticut Currency equivelant: 2:16 = 11^d
- Delivery from New London to Lebanon: 6d
- Total rate for delivery from Boston to Lebanon: 17^d
- Connecticut Currency of 17 pence = 1sh/5pence



- Way letter coming from the East of New London, where it was accepted and forwarded to Newport.
- Stanford to New London: 98 Miles: 1dwt 8gr
 New London to Newport: 58 Miles: 1dwt 8gr
 Total: 2dwt 16 gr
- The WW was rated at arrival and the NLfd marking later in time. The magenta color has only been seen in use from the New London Post Office.
