#### 1866 To 1868 Issues - Fifteen Cents Lincoln

The fifteen cent "memorial" issue, featuring a portrait of Abraham Lincoln, were first issued in 1866 upon the anniversary of Lincoln's death. The stamps were printed by National Bank Note Company. In 1868 fifteen cent stamps with impressed grills were introduced.







The American Banknote Company reprinted plate proofs in five different colors in 1881 at the request of the Post Office Department. For the fifteen cents Lincoln design they used the original National Bank Note Company die. These proofs were displayed at the International Cotton Exposition held in Atlanta, Georgia in 1881. Only one sheet of one hundred was printed in each of the five different colors.

The American Banknote Company reprinted plate proofs in five different colors in 1881 at the request of the Post Office Department. Only one sheet of one hundred was printed in each of the colors.

# 1866 Issue - Fifteen Cents Roosevelt Small Die Proof



A special printing of small die proofs was produced in 1904 by the Roosevelt Administration. Eighty five presentation albums were created using these proofs.

#### Pan-Pacific Small Die Proof



Fewer Than Six Reported Examples

A special printing of small die proofs was produced in 1915 for the Panama-Pacific Exposition. These proofs are on yellowish wove paper that differs from the wove paper of the earlier small die proofs.





One of the primary intended usages of the fifteen cents stamps was to prepay the single letter rate to France for a letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce. This rate was in effect until January 1, 1870.

The same plate, plate number 41, that was used to produce the 1866 issue was used and the other printing and production characteristics are identical.

The so-called "F" grill is similar to the "E" grill with points down but is somewhat more narrow, covering a 9 by 13mm area of each stamp. The exact quantity issued is unknown but it is estimated that 2,000,000 were issued. The same plate, plate number 41, that was used to produce the 1866 issue was used and the other printing and production characteristics are identical.
