The Life and Philatelic Covers of Arnold Wilson

The address of "A. Wilson" on a cover is quite familiar to collectors of Great Britain railway letter mail of the early 1900s. As collectors delve into that corner of philately, they encounter a significant figure in the making of souvenir covers with railway letter stamps - Arnold Wilson. While Capt. H.T. Jackson and others have chronicled the sometimes sketchy circumstances behind a few of the surcharges adorning some of these artifacts, little has been documented about the man behind them.

The non-philatelic cover below, ex Capt. H.T. Jackson and addressed to the "Executor of Mrs. Julia Wilson" in Manchester, proved to be a catalyst for my curiosity. Through research on online genealogy and newspaper sites, I uncovered that the addressee was the mother of our Mr. "A. Wilson." Surprisingly, his full name, Arnold Wilson, appears to have eluded previous publications.

Arnold Wilson, born in 1868 to Thomas Wilson (1830-1875) and Julia Barker (1831-1922) in Halifax, Yorkshire, England, played a pivotal role in the world of early railway letter mail. Growing up with siblings Herbert Wilson (1862-1939), Ada Wilson (1864), and Frank Wilson (1866), Arnold's family was documented in the 1871 England Census, where his father was listed as a sewing machine agent, and his mother-in-law, Judith Barker, earned income from railway shares.

In the 1881 census list, Arnold Wilson appeared as a scholar at a boarding school in Skircoat, Yorkshire, while his mother, Julia Wilson, assumed the role of head of the household, engaged in the furniture trade. Subsequent census records in 1891 and 1901 indicated Arnold's transition to a cabinet maker, residing at 50 Percival St., Chorlton on Medloc, in South Manchester, Lancashire.

By 1911, Arnold continued to share a residence with his mother, this time at the well-known "15 Beresford Rd, Longsight, Manchester" address. His life journey concluded in 1931 at the age of 63. To Arnold Wilson, we extend our gratitude for the invaluable legacy left behind.





On January 15, 1920 the railway letter fee was increased to 3d per letter by the Post Master General. The railway fee was increased again to 4d on September 1, 1920. During that interval, on June 1, 1920, the postage rate was increased from 1½d to 2d.

This cover was used during the three month period between June and September when the guiding rule that the railway fee should be double the postage was contravened.

Only 240 Great Western 2d stamps were overprinted for Port Talbot Railway, controls #167461 to 167700. Of these four sheets of 60, the first sheet still exists as two unused blocks of thirty. 




