Why it's extraordinary – Maritime mail is uncommon during the High Inflation period . The ship's purser was given a rate chart and stamps complying with that ship's departure date. Postcard above postmarked Deutsche Seepost / Ost Afrikanische / Hauptlinie "k".
The "k" signifies that it was mailed from the Steamer "Tanganjika" commissioned
October 15<sup>th</sup>, 1922.


Cross-Border Rate as Domestic Letter 60 Pfg.



Why it is extraordinary – Letter to foreign destination Emmishofen, Switzerland. When both sender and addressee lived within 30 km of the border, standard mail could be sent from Germany to the other side at inland rates. Applicable to Belgium, Denmark, Netherlands and Switzerland, but not to France or Poland. (Grenzverkehr)


#### **Foreign Letter Rate**

#### **300 Billion Marks**



Why it is extraordinary – Mailed from Chemnitz to Nulato, Alaska on December 11, 1923 the foreign letter rate had increased to 300 Billion Marks. The Rentenpfennig currency had been introduced on December 1, 1923 and the foreign letter rate had been reduced to 30 Rpfg. This letter contained 2 10 Rpfg. Stamps and 2 5 Rpfg. Stamps paying the new rate. The 100 Billion Marks in Marks currency was without force. Nulato, AK an exotic destination. (Pop. 43 in 1923)




Why it is extraordinary – Perfins on stamps of commercial establishments are fairly common, however semi-official perfins such as above MW – Magistrat Wiespaden are not.

Why it is extraordinary – Pursuant to the receiving stamp on the reverse, this letter was handled through the Berlin Rohrpost (Pneumatic tube system) by virtue of the Date, time and minute receiving cancel. Some Special Delivery Letters were handled in this manner without the Rohrpost surcharge.


